Purpose The role will involve an appropriate balance of teaching,

research, examining and assessment, course and curriculum coordination and development and administration. The focus of teaching and related activity will be in the undergraduate Interior

Design programme.

The role is expected to help deliver a challenging and supportive learning experience for all students, providing world-class teaching and contributing to the academic development of the School of Design within the overall context and vision of the Glasgow School of Art and contribute to all aspects of quality assurance with regard to learning, teaching and assessment

The Role

Principal Accountabilities

- To work as part of a team of academics and technical staff and be flexible and supportive of all School of Design activity (and GSA-wide);
- To deliver the curriculum to ensure maximum student potential is achieved teaching on the undergraduate Interior Design programme;
- To support the studio tuition of undergraduate students;
- To be actively involved in the development of learning support materials;
- To contribute to the activities in the Programme, e.g. curriculum development, course strategy, course promotion and maintaining and developing industrial liaisons:
- To assist in the recruitment, selection and admission of students;
- To participate in Quality Assurance procedures;
- To attend appropriate training courses when required as part of the School's academic development practices;
- To be responsive to individual student and/or group requirements;
- To contribute to the strategic planning of the Programme;
- To be involved in educational visits/trips, activities and exhibitions as directed by the Undergraduate Programme Leader;
- To undertake any other activities commensurate with the post.
- Ensuring compliance with School and GSA policies and procedures, standing orders and statutory requirements (e.g. the Data Protection Act, Race Equality);
- Cooperation and compliance with Health and Safety responsibilities, to ensure health and safety of self, as well as that of the students



Main Duties

- Work with the Undergraduate Programme Leader/Deputy Head of School and other undergraduate staff to plan and organise teaching delivery
- Write studio briefs and develop other relevant curriculum materials
- Deliver studio tuition in the form of briefs, crit groups, presentations
- Assess student work
- Share pastoral workload with other undergraduate staff

Other duties will also include: -

- Assessing applicant portfolios and interviewing candidates
- Maintaining a safe working studio environment
- Creating teaching support materials where appropriate
- Help organise educational trips, and gallery, studio or other relevant professional and academic visits
